WHAT

- Grants up to \$7,500 are available to cover rent, utilities, and inventory costs



WHO

- Must be a for-profit business with fewer than 50 full-time employees
- Must occupy a "brick and mortar" location in Delaware County in an industrial or commercial district
- Must be registered to conduct business within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania



WHEN

- The application window to submit online is May 6th from 12:01 am to 11:59 pm
- The application window to submit a paper copy is May 6th from 12 noon to 4:30 pm & May 7th from 8:30 am to 1:00 pm

Driver and Vehicle Services

What if my driver's license, photo ID card or learner's permit is scheduled to expire?

Driver licenses, photo ID cards and learner's permits scheduled to expire from March 16, 2020 through May 31, 2020 now have an extended expiration date:

June 30, 2020

Driver licenses and photo ID cards may also be renewed online anytime at [DMV.pa.gov](https://www.dmv.pa.gov).

Effective April 30, expiration dates for driver licenses, photo ID cards, and learner's permits scheduled to expire from March 16, 2020 through May 31, 2020, are now extended through **June 30, 2020**.
