How it works: Volunteers will unload donations from your vehicle's trunk when you drive through the school parking lot. Please stay in your car as volunteers remove donations.

Items needed: Dry food goods, peanut butter, canned meats and tuna, stews, soups, and cereal. We also need items that cannot be purchased with SNAP benefits: paper towels, toilet paper, dish soap, laundry detergent, toothpaste, deodorant, bar soap for bathing, baby diapers, baby wipes, formula, hand sanitizer, and cleaning wipes.
